
#### **Walk Audit**

## **Open House**


 A hands-on public meeting inviting the neighborhood to tell us what they want to see changed about N. Mason Street




## **Design MeEting**


Academy participants then used the knowledge we gained through training and information learned through the walk audit and the Open House to collaboratively design the changes to N. Mason Street


