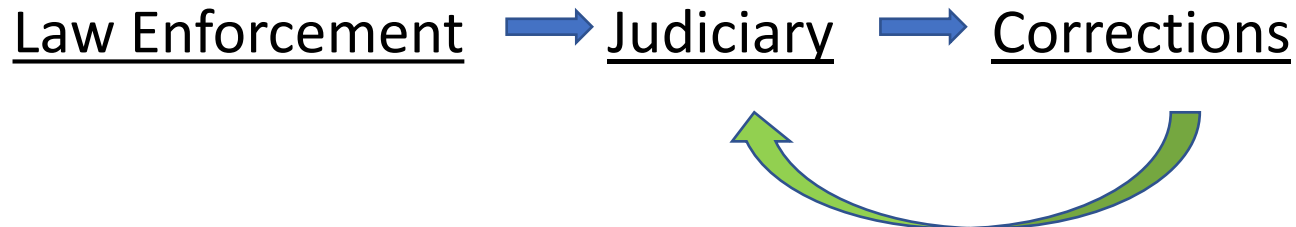

- Approved access for the Criminal Justice Planner
 - Allows access to data that is PRIOR to incarceration
 - Jails are recipients are those remanded and
 - sentenced to their custody



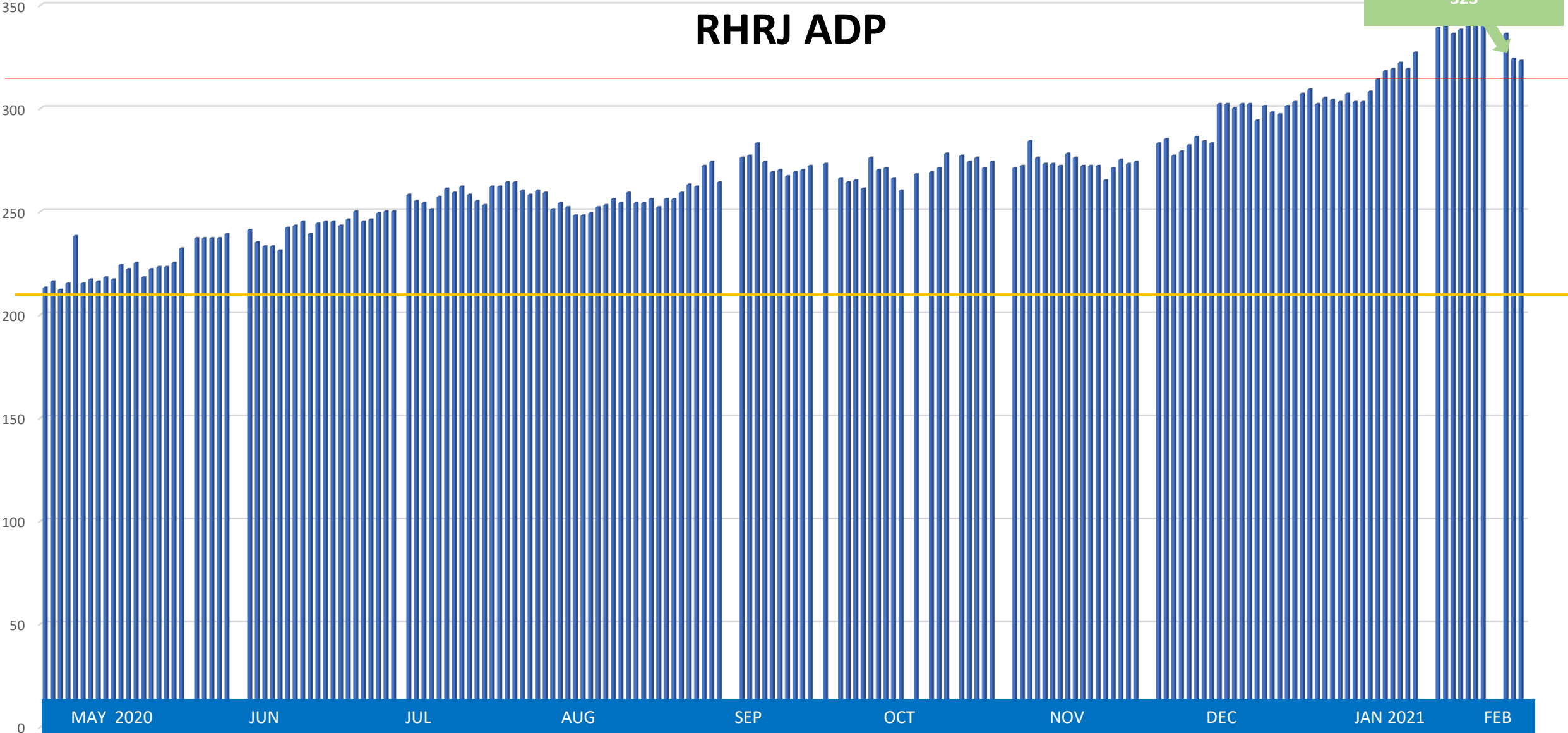

- **Definitions Vary by Locality/Jurisdiction**

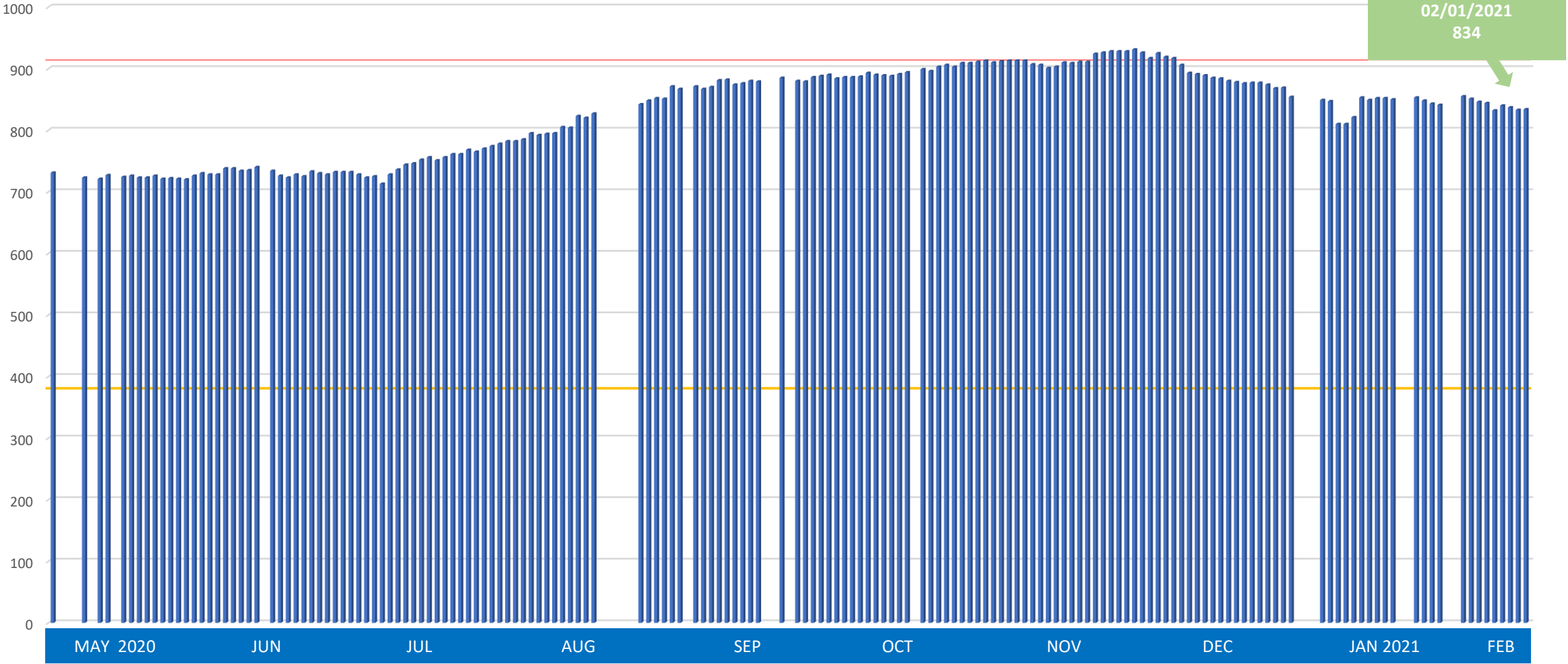

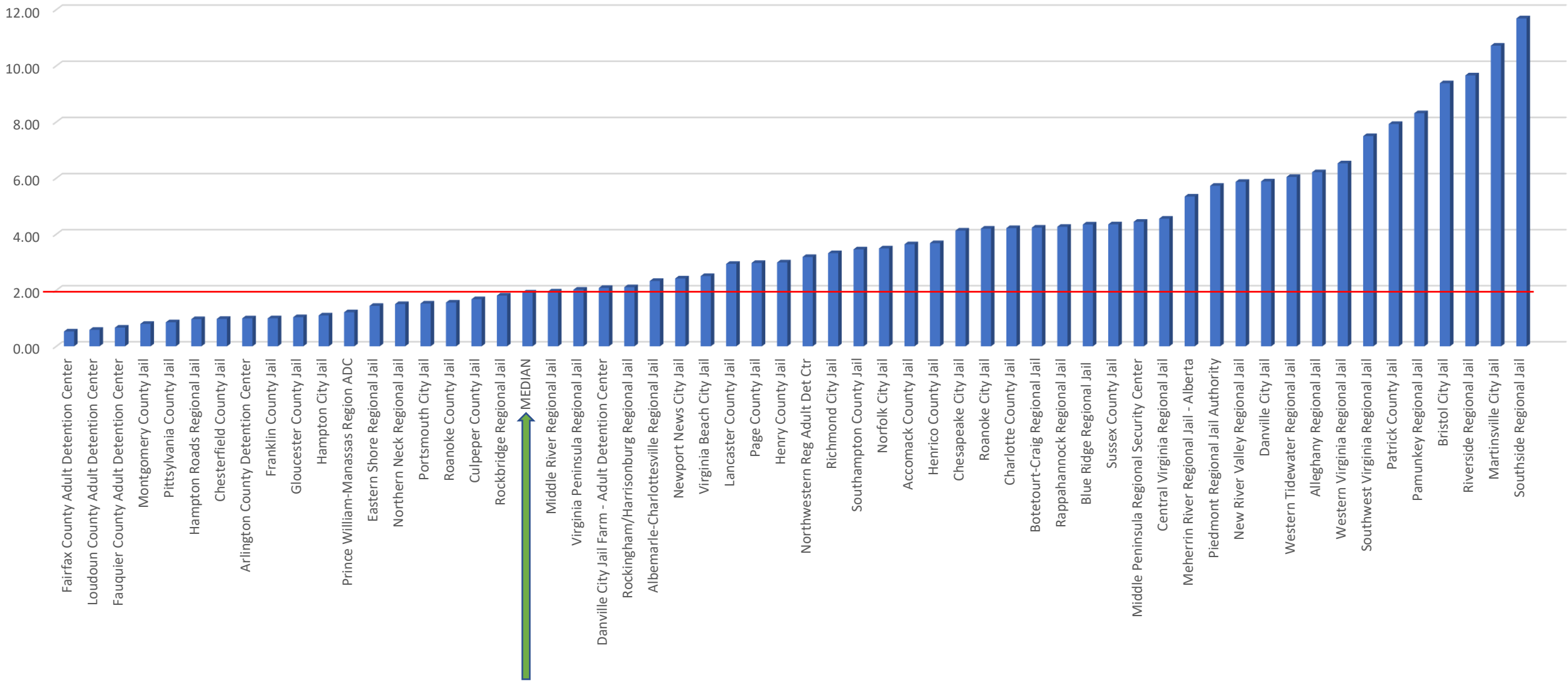

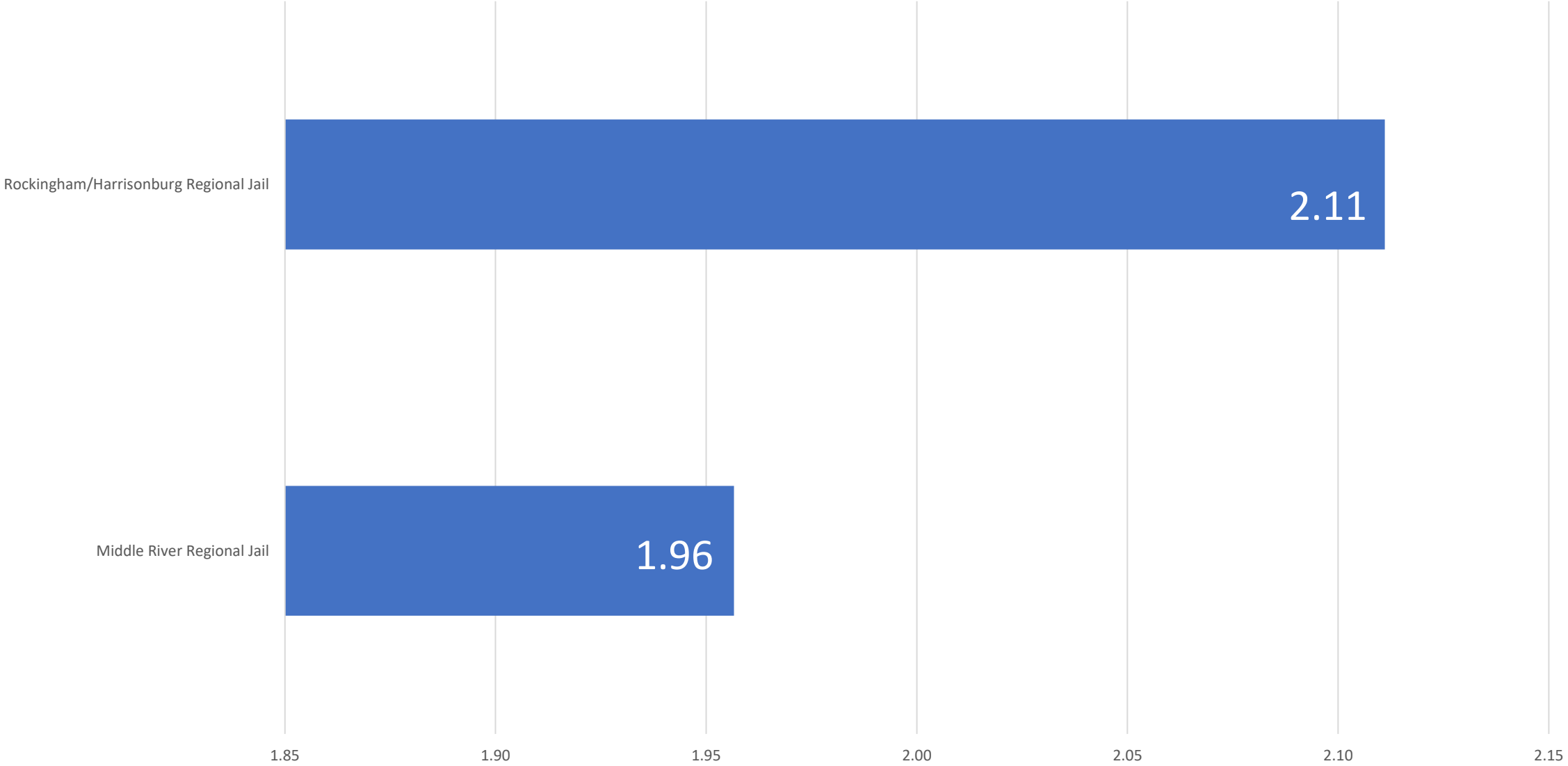

RATE INCARCERATED PER 1000

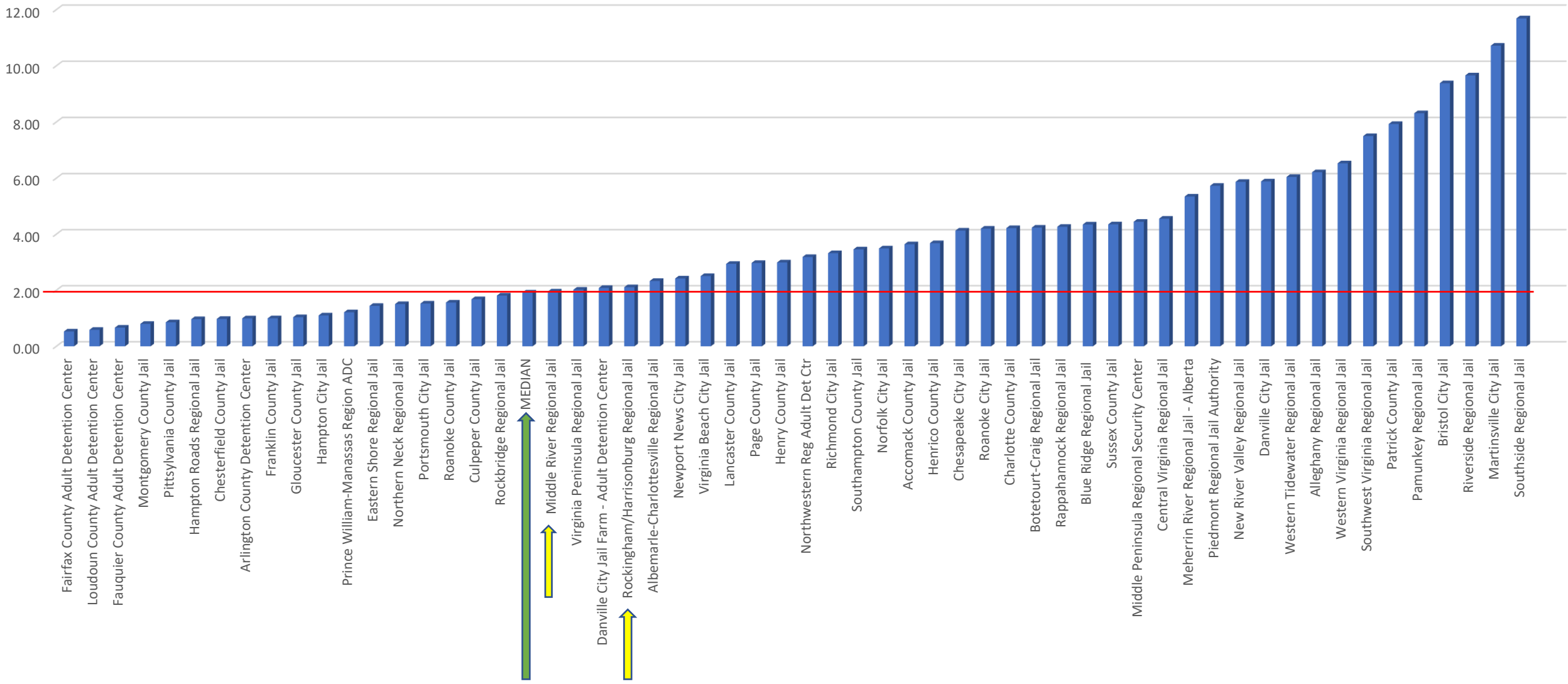

CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

I agree to abide by the following conditions as required by the Rockingham County General District Court and the Rockingham-Harrisonburg Court Services Unit.

1. To report by phone and/or in person to a case manager as scheduled.
2. To reside at _____ and to notify my case manager prior to any change of residence or telephone number. Residence verification may be required.
3. To follow my case manager's instructions and be truthful and cooperative.
4. To notify my case manager of any change in employment or educational status within one week. Verification of employment may be required.
5. To appear in court for any proceeding as ordered by the Court.
6. To not use, own, possess, transport, or carry a firearm if I have been convicted of a felony or have ever been convicted of a domestic assault (misdemeanor or felony).
7. To keep the peace, be of good behavior, and obey all Municipal, County, State, and Federal laws and ordinances, and to report to my case manager any arrests or citations, including traffic tickets, within three days.
8. To refrain from the use of illegal drugs and the abuse of alcohol; to undergo random drug/alcohol testing upon request.
9. To not travel outside the State of Virginia without first notifying my case manager.
10. To fulfill the following additional conditions ordered by the Court: **CASE-BY-CASE**

Paradigm Shift

Prevention versus Reaction

- Increasing the Investment in the Community and its Citizens decreases the numbers of individuals in the criminal justice system
 - Employment and Job/Skills Training
 - Medical and Mental Health Support
 - Education
 - Human Services and Programs

Future Jail Diversion Opportunities

Mental Health Docket/Court: Evaluate establishing a General District Court Docket to review and hear cases for only those persons predetermined to qualify for this specialized process.

In lieu of jail time, mental health treatment, substance abuse treatment, and/or other court requirements could be ordered. A mental health team consisting of the Judge, Commonwealth's Attorney, defense attorney, probation or pre-trial services, and CSB staff person review and establish individualized treatment recommendations in concert with legal restrictions outside of the jail walls. This evidence-based model has been implemented in several Virginia localities.

Action – establish work group to evaluate and make recommendation to CCJB.
