RE: Bond Cost Estimate Spreadsheet Update
Date: May 14, 2025

As you are aware, the City of Harrisonburg requires private developers to post bonds to ensure the construction of public infrastructure and installation of erosion and stormwater management practices as part of development projects. The City provides a spreadsheet to allow a straightforward and consistent way of determining bond amounts. The last time this spreadsheet's unit costs were updated was in 2014. Even the 2014 update contained unit costs that had not changed since 2004. Since the last update, construction costs have increased substantially, to the point that the unit costs in the spreadsheet are now completely unrealistic.

City staff are proposing an updated bond cost estimate spreadsheet, attached, and would like to give the development community an opportunity to review and comment. The proposed update includes several items that did not appear in previous versions. Also, the unit cost basis has increased across the board. Several sources were used to arrive at the new unit costs, including recent bids on City and VDOT projects, recommendations from the Departments of Public Works and Public Utilities, consultation with suppliers, and Consumer Price Index adjustments.

City staff intend to bring the updated bond cost estimate spreadsheet to City Council with a recommendation for adoption in July.
