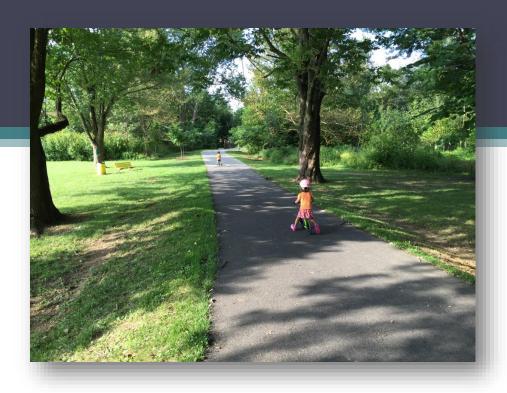

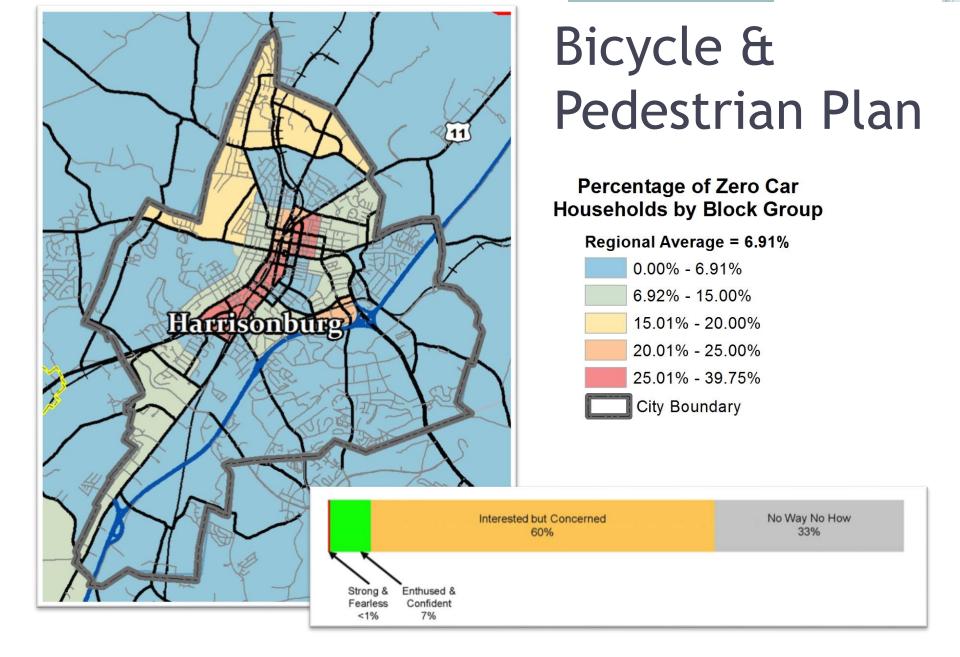

• Vision:

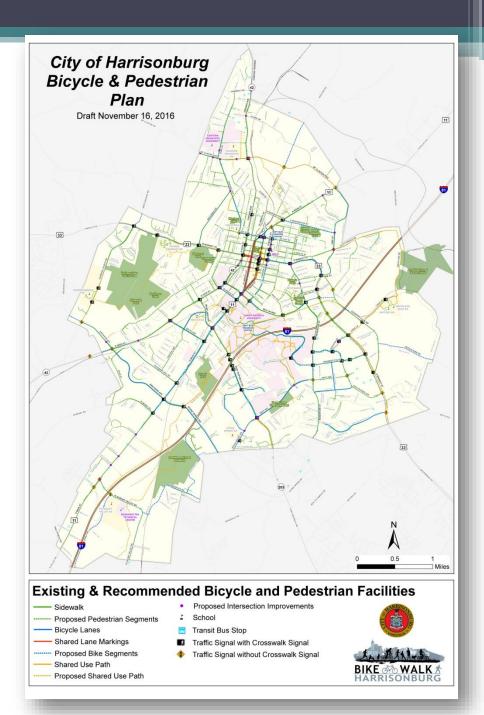

 - Partner with JMU, VDOT, other entities

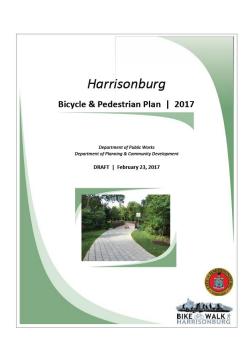
