Mental Health & Trauma – Its real...

- ✓ Over 20% of America's youth: **diagnosed** with a mental health disorder.
- ✓ Suicide leading cause of death ages 15-24.
- ✓ Over 70% of youth in juvenile justice systems have a mental illness.
- ✓ 37% of students who suffer from a mental illness drop out of school.
- ✓ Unresolved childhood trauma can lead:
 - ✓ Life of crime,
 - ✓ Depression
 - ✓ Anxiety
 - ✓ PTSD
 - ✓ Other mental illnesses.



THE VALUE OF EDUCATION

MAKES PEOPLE HEALTHIER

Each extra year of a mother's schooling reduce the probability of infant mortality by 5% to 10%.

INCREASES

One extra year of schooling increases an individual's earnings by up to 10%.

SAVES CHILDREN'S LIVES

A child whose mother can read is 50% more likely to live past age 5.

REDUCES POVERTY

If all students in low-income countries lefschool with basic reading skills 171 million people could be lifted out

PROMOTES GIRLS' AND WOMEN'S RIGHTS

One additional school year can increase a woman's earnings by 10% to 20%

BOOSTS ECONOMIC GROWTH

Each additional year of schooling raises average annua gross domestic product (GDP) growth by 0.37%.

RAISES CROP YIELDS


Investing in girls educatio could boost sub-Saharan Africa agricultural output by 25%.

FOSTERS PEACE

If the enrollment rate for secondary schooling is 10% higher than the average, the risk of war is reduced by about 3%

Step 1: Emergency Responders



- 1. Arrive at scene:
 - Police call
 - Fire call
 - Rescue call
- **2. Identify** school age students (if any) affecting/involved:
 - Simply obtain <u>students name and school</u>
- 3. As soon as feasible, HRECC contacted via phone for a "Handle With Care Notification"

Step 2: HRECC



- 1. "HandleWith Care Notification" received via phone
- 2. Dispatcher brings up the Alpha Page System, types:


"City HWC: Johnny Doe, Stone Springs Elementary"

Step 3: City Central Office & Schools



- 1. Central Office:
 - a. Student name and school is validated
 - b. School Principal & others notified prior to the start of school
- **2. Schools:** put into place for that student for the day(s)
 - Being supportive of the student throughout the day
 - Gently engaging the student to open communications
 - Recognizing the need to consider other resources (School Guidance, etc.)
 - Making sure the child has a good day, despite the trauma the day before
 - Engaging in Trauma Informed Care & Classroom

The Only Goal:

Make sure the child is <u>Handled With Care</u> at school that day, to make the best of their stressful experience.







Long Term Effects of "Handle With Care"




















Harrisonburg Specifics
