

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HARRISONBURG, VIRGINIA,
DETERMINING THAT SECOND SCANNERS ARE NOT NECESSARY FOR CERTAIN
ELECTION PRECINCTS IN THE CITY.**

WHEREAS, Virginia Code Section 24.2-627 requires City Council to provide at least one scanner for each election precinct provided, however, that each precinct having more than 4000 registered voters shall be provided with at least two scanner at a presidential election unless city Council, in consultation with the general registrar and the electoral board, determines that a second scanner is not necessary at any such precinct on the basis of voter turnout and the average wait time for voters in previous presidential elections; and


WHEREAS, the City’s General Registrar and Electoral Board have advised City Council that the Simms precinct has 4,078 registered voters and the Waterman precinct has 4,103 registered voters; and

WHEREAS, the City’s General Registrar and Electoral Board have further advised City Council that, based on voter turnout and the average wait times in the Simms and Waterman precincts in previous elections, and with the increased use of early voting that a second scanner is not necessary for either of those precincts.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF HARRISONBURG, VIRGINIA:**

That the City Council of the City of Harrisonburg, Virginia, after consultation with the City’s General Registrar and Electoral Board, hereby determines that a second scanner is not necessary at the Simms precinct and the Waterman precinct based on voter turnout and the average wait times for voters in those precincts in previous presidential elections.
