Preliminary Report on Financial Implications of High School Addition

Background:

The past several weeks have brought about a number of media reports about the need for expansion of Harrisonburg High School. Given the costs associated with that project, I felt it would be appropriate to present you with a preliminary report of the financial implications of the possible projects.

It is acknowledged that there is a need for more classroom and support space at Harrisonburg High School. Perhaps the most important issue that will need to be resolved is the timing of construction desired by the Superintendent and School Board versus the feasibility of the project for the City within the HCPS desired time frame from the perspective of cost, taxes and other financial implications.

Key Issues Summary:

As this is a "Preliminary Report on Financial Implications of High School Addition", the key issue is the impact that the projects could have on the City's budget, tax rate and financial standing.

The attached document, entitled, "HHS Addition - Financial Impacts", lists the preliminary costs estimates associated with the construction project, its projected debt service and the impact of the debt service on the tax rate. The costs listed for the HHS Addition are those quoted by both the Superintendent and the Project Architect in various news reports with approximately \$5M being added to each proposed cost for required architectural and engineering fees. Also included on the attachment are cost projections associated with the possible acquisition of property as well as a preliminary estimate on staffing and operations costs for the new addition.
