What is LEAP?




The Local Energy Alliance Program (LEAP) is a nonprofit founded in Charlottesville in 2009 and expanded to working throughout Virginia 2012.

Household Energy Uses






Nearly 50% of household energy use goes to heating & cooling –

Home Energy Efficiency starts with...




Home Energy Assessment

- 1-2 hour inspection by certified residential Building Analyst
- Blower door test to measure air leakage
- Thermal imaging to locate insulation & air sealing issues
- Report on the home of efficiency issues & solutions to them





Normal opportunities where we find the biggest "bang for the buck" action are with insulation and air sealing of older and manufactured homes!




Home Energy Efficiency Retrofit



Scope of work normally includes:

- Replace incandescent light bulbs with LEDs
- Efficient, low-flow showerheads
- Efficient, low-flow faucet aerators
- Pipe wrap insulation for hot water pipes
- Attic insulation and air sealing
- Electric heating tune ups and replacement especially for electric furnace/baseboard heating for example
- Can consider fuel switching from fuel oil/propane to high efficiency heat pumps



External Funding Opportunity



DHCD to launch Housing Innovation Partnership grants

- \$5.5 million of total grant funding for lowincome energy efficiency
- Application window likely to open in December with funding available in early 2022
- Potential to do a pilot project
- LEAP would like to collaborate with Harrisonburg in some form to deliver benefits to low-income families
