RE: 2018 Residential Permit Parking Area along North Liberty Street

**Summary:**

Residents have requested and City staff has reviewed and recommended the approval of adding a residential parking permit area along North Liberty Street, in the vicinity of West Washington Street to Edom Road.

**Background:**

This issue originally arose through requests by residents along North Liberty Street for the City to address the increase of on-street parking. These individuals also prepared and accomplished the attached petition, which initiated the formal residential permit parking consideration as outlined in the City Code. After acceptance of the petition, Harrisonburg Police staff conducted a survey of the users of the on-street parking and determined the vast majority of the vehicles parked did not belong to residents of this neighborhood. Finally, the Transportation Safety Advisory Committee considered the request and supporting data and recommended for approval of the new residential permit parking area.
