


Summary of survey responses:

- COVID hits ALICE households harder.
 Chronic stress and collective trauma on top of already struggling financially.
- ALICE workers are more vulnerable.
 Essential workers in front line positions have lower wages. Many don't have the option to work remotely or from home.
- ALICE families with children struggle more. With school closures, virtual learning, and limited childcare options, parents choose between going to work and staying home.





Respondents below the ALICE Threshold were *significantly more likely* than respondents above the ALICE Threshold to say their biggest concern was paying housing costs (26% vs. 4%), having enough food for the household (6% vs. 1%), or paying off debt (5% vs. 2%).








Network Activity Overview
