

ORIGINAL CAYCE PLACE

- 716 barrack style apartments
- No central air
- Concentrated poverty
- Average income per household: \$7,104

NEW VISION FOR CAYCE PLACE

- Create a mixed-income, mixed-use neighborhood with 2,399 total apartments
- Different design for each phase so that it blends in with the surrounding area
- Market-rate amenities
- One-for-one replacement of all subsidized/affordable units, while adding new subsidized/affordable, workforce and market-rate apartments
- New amenities such as a grocery store, pharmacy, school, library and retailers
- Several acres of active green space



NAPIER PLACE AND SUDEKUM APARTMENTS

- Began reengaging Napier Place and Sudekum Apartments residents in October 2022 on the Transformation of their community
- Starting in March 2023, MDHA staff worked closely with resident ambassadors to re-survey residents at the two properties
- 424 households completed survey representing 56% of currently leased units
- The survey wrapped up in early June and staff are working with residents to interpret the results now









NAPIER PLACE AND SUDEKUM APARTMENTS SITE PLAN
