EXECUTIVE PROFILE

Dr. Reid is a visionary leader and analytical methodologist. In 2013 she retired from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), where she was an intelligence analyst who designed an innovative project nominated for the FBI Director's Award. Because of the project, she got an opportunity to brief Robert Mueller, Director of the FBI. Later, she was transferred to a new assignment to implement the project methodology.

Prior to FBI, she held positions at the CIA, private industry (e.g., MITRE Corporation), and taught at several universities (e.g., Rutgers University). For ten years, she was in Southeast Asia where she taught at Nanyang Technological University (NTU), Singapore, and worked as an entrepreneur in Malaysia.

After retiring from the FBI, she joined the faculty at James Madison University (JMU), Harrisonburg, Virginia. Dr. Reid was a member of the Cyber Council at the Intelligence and National Security Alliance (INSA) and was on the team that wrote the 2015 report "Cyber Intelligence: Preparing Today's Talent for Tomorrow Threats." In 2017, she used the report to support the design and justification of the JMU Cyber Intelligence Graduate Certificate. Currently, she is an adjunct professor in the online and part-time program <https://jmu.edu/cyberintel>.

Cyber intelligence (intel) is an emerging discipline involving data gathering, monitoring, and analysis of cybersecurity threats and threat actors' activities, motivations, capabilities, and intentions. It uses critical thinking, teamwork, and interdisciplinary approaches (e.g., geopolitical, financial, sociological, linguistic, and cultural) in its analysis which is used to support strategic and tactical decision making about cybersecurity. Since all disciplines (e.g., social sciences, humanities, and STEM) include analysis, this provides an analytical path to decrease the employment gap and expand diversity in cybersecurity in terms of thought, skills, leadership, gender, race, sexual orientation, and neurodiversity.

Dr. Reid has a Doctorate in Library Science (DLS) from the University of Southern California, Master of Library Science (MLS) from University of Maryland, Graduate Certificate in Denial and Deception from National Intelligence University, and a B.S. from D.C. Teacher College, Washington, D.C., USA.
