RE: Participation in City Council meetings through electronic communications

<u>Summary:</u> Consider adopting a policy for participation by City Council members in City Council meetings through electronic communications.

Background: Section 2.2-3708.2 of the Code of Virginia permits members of local governing bodies to participate in meetings through electronic communications, provided a quorum is still physically present and the governing body has adopted a written policy for participation via electronic communications.

<u>Key Issues:</u> Adoption of this written policy will allow Council members to continue to participate in City Council meetings even if an emergency prevents their physical presence. For example, if a Council member were instructed to self-quarantine, that Council member would have the option of notifying the Mayor that he or she still wishes to participate in an upcoming meeting via electronic communications.
