What other interests or concerns do you have regarding the community? I am concerned with education and health services for youth, particularly mental health iris important that all the youth of Harrisonburg are getting the education and guidance they need to make healthy choices. For many of our kids, there are language and cultural barriers to factor in as well. Helping kids and families navigate the rougher waters seems like one of the more important tasks in our community. I also believe the Harrisonburg must work with JMU to promote responsible growth. Making the city bicycle friendly, with good mass transit, can reduce our dependence on automobiles.

It is also important to keep the police departments funded and well-trained as the city grows. I grew up in a large metro area with too much crime and too few police. Public safety is important.
