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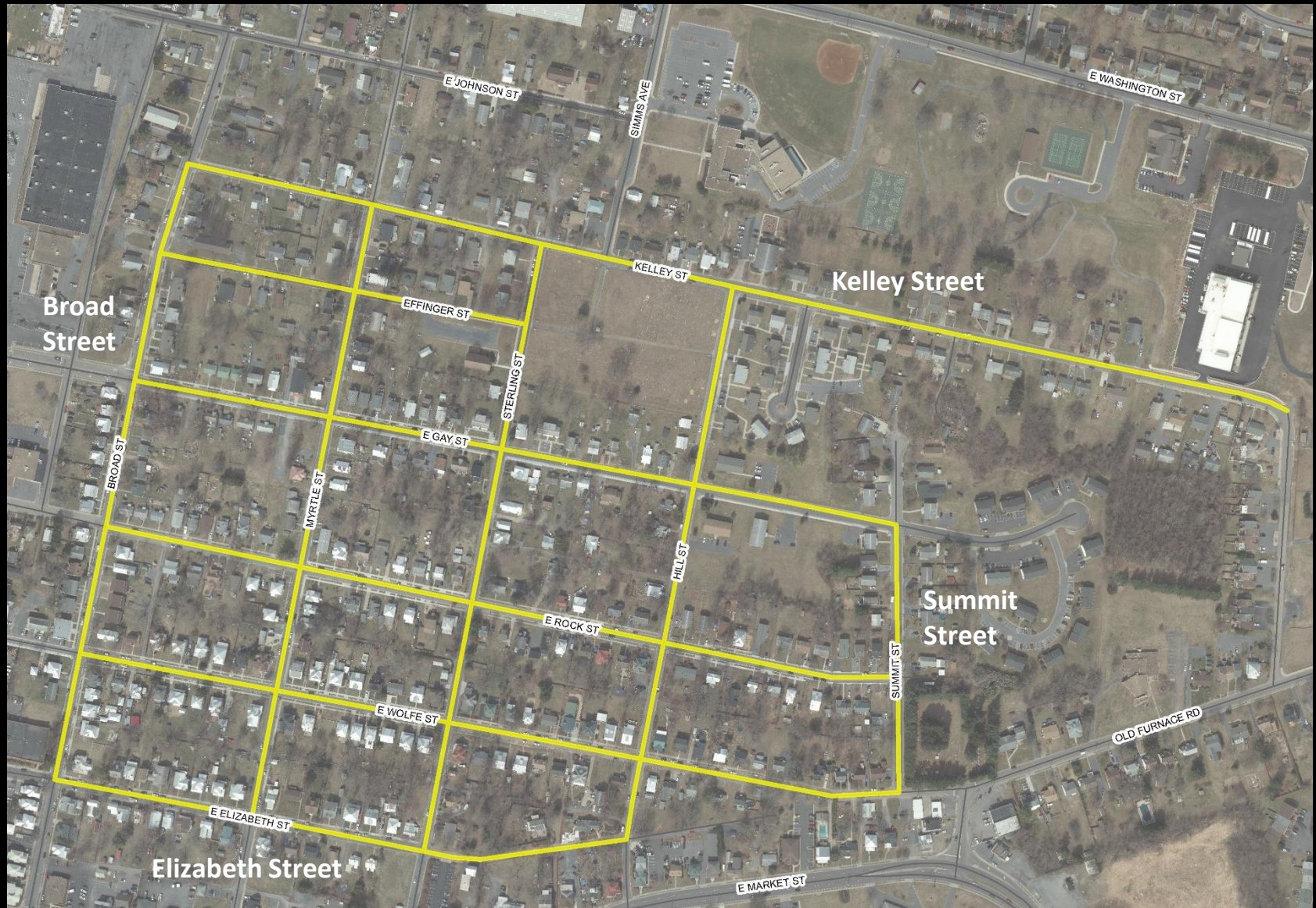
Timeframe

- 2008 – Initial efforts by neighborhood to enter NTCP
- July 2014 and Oct 2016 – Team Up to Slow Down Campaign
- November 2016 – Increased Enforcement
- July 2017 – Neighborhood Meeting
- September 2017 – Council Approved Traffic Study
- February 2018 – Study Complete and Petition Process
- January 2020 – Required Signatures Received
- January 2020 – Seeking Enrollment

Traffic Study Summary

- December 2017 Study:
 - ADT > 600 vehicles per day
 - 85th Percentile Speeds > 35 mph
 - Documented Cut-Through Traffic
- Summit, Hill, Sterling, Broad, Kelley, Gay, Wolfe, Elizabeth
- Established Neighborhood Area

Next Steps

- Spring-Fall 2020 – Neighborhood Meetings to Develop Traffic Calming Plan
- Fall/Winter 2020 – Finalize Traffic Calming Plan
- Fall/Winter 2020 – Transportation Safety and Advisory Commission Recommendation
- Winter 2021 – Council Approval of Plan
- Winter/Spring 2021 – Begin Implementation
- Future – Study, Revise, Implement, etc.
