# Program History

- Grant program overhauled in 2019
- Changes were intended to make the funding process more transparent, more accessible, and more equitable
- Standard application and evaluation processes were created

# Application and Evaluation Process

- Two application categories:
  - \$5,000 and under
  - Above \$5,000
- The application asks for summary, agency, and program information.
  - Slight variations between the applications for the two categories
- The evaluation process relies on a standard rubric and an evaluation committee.
- The Evaluation Committee scores applications and develops a funding recommendation for submission to the city manager.

# Overview

- Council asked staff to return with recommendations for application funding categories.
- The program currently faces several challenges.
- Staff has recommendations for modifications to the program to ease the existing challenges
- According to City Code, the grant application must close by January 30.

# Funding Categories

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# Recommended Funding Categories

**1. Mental and Physical Health**

**2. Housing and Homelessness**

**3. Inclusive and Welcoming**

**4. Arts and Culture**

**5. Youth Supports**

**6. Other**

- Funding categories would not be considered during the scoring of applications.
- Applicants would self-select their primary service category.
- Council could direct the evaluation committee to greater prioritize some categories for funding, based on alignment with its adopted Vision.
- Categories will enhance reporting on grant impact.

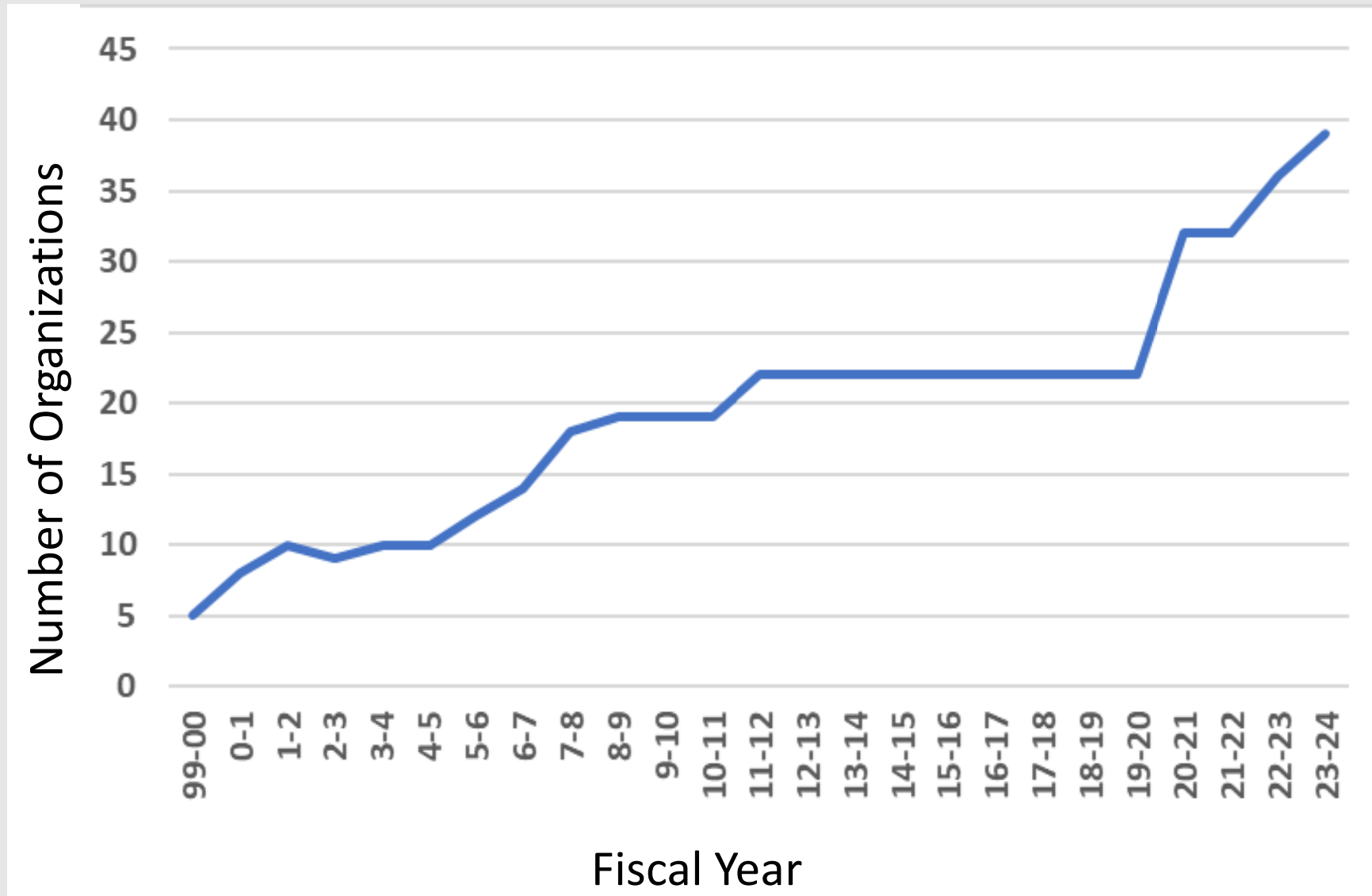
Increasing average funding request



# Funding Levels from FY21 – FY24

<b>FY20-21</b>	<b>\$430,000</b>
<b>FY21-22</b>	<b>\$508,000</b>
<b>FY22-23</b>	<b>\$496,650</b>
<b>FY23-24</b>	<b>\$400,000</b>

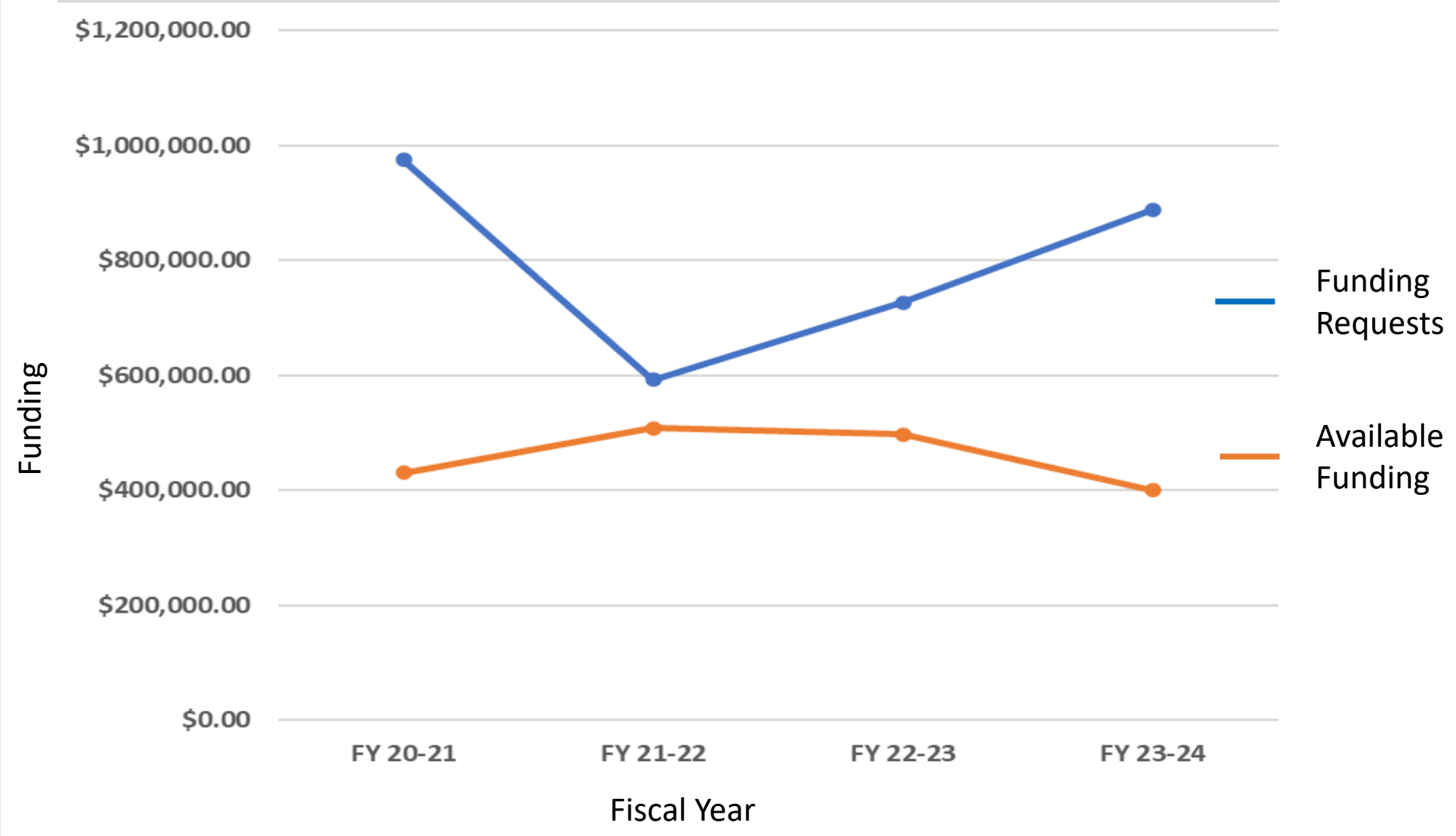
# Increasing Number of Organizations Receiving Funds

<b>FY21-22</b>	\$591,831	\$18,495

<b>FY23-24</b>	\$888,559	\$22,784

# FY24 Funding Cycle – 39 Applications

	<b>Request</b>	<b>Award</b>
<b>Total</b>	\$888,599	\$400,000
<b>Average</b>	\$22,784	\$10,256
<b>Maximum Individual</b>	\$64,656	\$29,000
<b>Max % of Operating Budget</b>	32.5%	12.9%
<b>Average % of Operating Budget</b>	6.5%	2.4%

# Funding Request Cap Recommendation

Staff recommends capping requested amounts at **5% of operating budget** or **\$30,000**, whichever is lower.

1.5%	1.75%	2%	5%	5% + \$30k cap
\$391,600	\$457,000	\$525,800	\$1.3 million	\$801,000

## Based on FY24 applications:

- 20 organizations requested less than the recommended cap
- 18 organizations requested more than the recommended cap
- 1 organization's request equaled the recommended cap

# Program Recommendations

## Recommendation 1:

Staff recommends creating the following funding categories on the Civic and Community Organization Grant Program application:

1. **Mental and Physical Health**
2. **Housing and Homelessness**
3. **Inclusive and Welcoming**
4. **Arts and Culture**
5. **Youth Supports**
6. **Other**

## Recommendation 2:

Staff recommend capping requested amounts at **5% of operating budget** or **\$30,000**, whichever is lower.
