All of the monies appropriated as shown by the contained items in Sections I through XIX are appropriated upon the terms, conditions and provisions herein before set forth in connection with said items and those set forth in this section and in accordance with the provisions of the official code of the City of Harrisonburg, Virginia, Edition 1979, now in effect or hereafter adopted or amended, relating hereto.

That the rate of taxation of Real Estate and Manufactured Homes as defined in Section 36-85.3, of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, be fixed at Seventy-Eight Cents (\$0.78) on each one hundred dollars (\$100) assessed valuation for fiscal year 2016-2017; and that the rate of taxation on tangible Personal Property (including business vehicles but exclusive of for-hire vehicles) as defined by Article 1 of Chapter 35 of Title 58.1 of the Code of Virginia, be fixed at Three Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$3.50) on each one hundred dollars (\$100) assessed valuation for fiscal year 2016-2017 except for the rate on business personal property be fixed at Two Dollars and Twelve Cents (\$2.12) on each one hundred dollars (\$100) assessed valuation for fiscal year 2016-2017; and that the rate of taxation on Machinery and Tools as defined by Article 2 of Chapter 35 of Title 58.1, of the Code of Virginia, be fixed at Two Dollars and Twelve Cents (\$2.12) on each one hundred dollars (\$100) assessed valuation for fiscal year 2016-2017. Real estate taxes are collectible one half on or before December 5, 2016 and one half on or before June 5, 2017. Tangible personal property taxes, manufactured homes taxes and machinery and tools taxes are collectible on or before December 5, 2016. It is expressly provided that the provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to household goods and personal effects as enumerated in Section 58.1-3504 of said Code, if such goods and effects be owned and used by an individual or by a family or household incident to maintaining an abode, which goods and effects are hereby declared wholly exempt from taxation.

That the rate of fee or service charge imposed on Real Estate property exempt from regular taxation shall be twenty percent (20%) of the real estate tax rate levied by the City Council in the above paragraph, which applies to the real estate for which the City furnished police and fire protection and for the collection and disposal of refuse, and where such real estate is exempt from taxation under Sections 58.1-3606 through 58.1-3608 of the Code of Virginia. Pursuant to Section 58.1-3400 through 58.1-3407 Code of Virginia, as amended, rate of service charge shall be Fifteen and One-Half Cents (\$0.155) on each one hundred dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation for fiscal year 2016-2017 and are collectible one half on or before December 5, 2016 and one half on or before June 5, 2017. The above service charge shall apply to all real property except those specifically exempted from the service charge as provided in such section. (Such as property owned by the Commonwealth, hospitals, cemeteries, churches, etc.)

That the salaries, wages and allowances set out in detail in the budget statement and in the documents entitled "Classification Titles and Compensation Ranges Fiscal Year 2016-2017", and "Salary Schedule Fiscal Year 2016-2017", and adopted by the City Council for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, both dates inclusive, be, and they are hereby authorized and fixed as the maximum compensation to be allowed officers and employees for the services rendered, unless otherwise directed by the City Manager. Any positions not specifically listed in the budget document may not be filled without prior written approval of the City Manager.

That any budgeted project in the various capital project funds or any budgeted amounts in other funds, for which funds will not be received (i.e. grants or other intergovernmental revenue) or borrowed as anticipated, may have the appropriation reduced by the amount(s) not received or borrowed as directed by the City Manager.

That the fees for building, electrical, plumbing, mechanical and sign permits that are set out in the attached schedules remain unchanged and are hereby readopted by City Council upon adoption of this ordinance. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall become effective July 1, 2016.
