RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HARRISONBURG, VIRGINIA, TO RESCIND IT'S SUPPORT FOR THE PACIFIC PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

WHEREAS Harrisonburg City Council adopted on October 9, 2012 a resolution that "the Harrisonburg City Council calls upon the United States Trade Representative to make strong intellectual property protections a top priority in negotiating the Trans Pacific Partnership Agreement and supports a 12-year term for regulatory data protection of biologics to ensure that biopharmaceutical companies will continue to invest in research and development."; and

WHEREAS the Resolution was connected to the Trans Pacific Partnership (TPP) trade and investors' rights agreement; and

WHEREAS the TPP agreement was not available to be reviewed by the public until 2016, and thus Harrisonburg City Council had no knowledge of the details of the TPP; and

WHEREAS the TPP places local policy-making bodies under the review of corporate dominated international tribunals, thus threatening the rights of all American citizens.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT the Harrisonburg City Council rescinds its support from the previously adopted Resolution;

AND FURTHERMORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Harrisonburg City Council urges our Congressional Representative Bob Goodlatte, US Senators Mark Warner and Tim Kaine, US Congress as a whole, and the President of the United States, Barack Obama, to oppose the TPP.
