Please tell us about yourself and why you want to serve.

Why are you interested in serving on a board or commission?

I'm interested in serving Harrisonburg because I am grateful for the opportunity to live here. I'm originally from Houston, Texas. I came to Harrisonburg after attending Washington and Lee University School of Law because it is a beautiful, dynamic city. I saw a thriving immigrant community, two excellent universities, walkable neighborhoods near downtown, moderate housing costs, and a strong sense of community to be very attractive as a young professional. I plan to serve, largely to build on those strengths in the boards and commissions.

What other interests or concerns do you have regarding the community?

I am strongly motivated by my interest in protecting the environment, but in so many ways, helping the environment also helps us. Harrisonburg is a growing city. Mayor Reed has stated at recent City Council Meetings that our population is expected to grow to as large as 75,000 in the next few years. There are two paths we can follow - we can build up or build out. One path follows the trend of car-centric development south of I-81, with more massive parking lots connecting big box stores requiring everyone to buy expensive cars, whether they can afford them or not. Or we can aim for more development like downtown, where I live - encourage mixed commercial/residential development so everyone can have a local corner store. We can allow townhouses and in neighborhoods close to downtown to limit housing costs. We can focus more on sidewalks, separated bike paths and greenways to connect residences, schools, and businesses. In short, we can make our city richer, healthier, and more connected, all at once. I can't tell you the freedom there is in being able to walk or bike to work and the grocery store every week, as I do.

What relevant experience or education do you have to this board or commission?

I am a recent graduate of Washington and Lee University School of Law, having taken courses in administrative law, environmental law, and land use/zoning. As a research assistant for Professor Fraley, I researched municipal codes in environmental and public nuisance contexts. Most importantly, working for the Ritchie Law Firm I see firsthand the impact of car accidents and disability in this community - I've learned the hardships clients face to get around after their car is totaled and sidewalks can't accommodate their wheelchair because a telephone pole blocks the path. And I've learned the lifechanging value of the Community Services Board (CSB) and Healthy Communities Health Centers (HCHC) for those who otherwise couldn't afford treatment.

I am on the steering committee of the Climate Action Alliance of the Valley (CAAV), and help to coordinate climate outreach. I hope to participate in Harrisonburg Citizen Academy this year, and am a member of the Harrisonburg/Rockingham Bar Association.
