To our City Council Representatives,

We want to express our appreciation for your consideration of this urgent appeal as concerned citizens of our richly diverse Harrisonburg community, as a nation, and as global human family to call for an immediate and permanent ceasefire in Gaza. We have come to deeply appreciate the spirit of our community as a sanctuary for so many immigrants and refugees, and as community that believes in the beauty and preciousness of all human life, and which respects and supports the equal dignity and rights of all human beings as created in the image of God. As such we believe we must speak and act for justice in this spirit from all levels of our society. We are convinced that movements for transformation and social change, particularly in a democracy, fundamentally grow from the inside out and from the bottom up, and as such, what we do at the grassroots level matters profoundly in a system of governance that purports to be "of the people, by the people, and for the people."

As has been set forth by so many voices in our community, across this country, and around the world, the violence going on in Gaza, the toll on human life, most of which has been civilian and predominantly children, and the destruction of civilian infrastructure, has been on a scale that has been profoundly disturbing by any definition or characterization. The denial of avenues for humanitarian aid to the now desperate and impoverished 2.2 million people of Gaza has created a humanitarian disaster that is without parallel anywhere in the world right now. As a nation that has been aligned as an ally to Israel, who have given billions of our taxpayer dollars in military aid, essentially underwriting their military machine, and as a world power with veto privileges in the United Nations Security Council we bear a great responsibility in what is being allowed to happen there. Our moral compass or lack thereof has enormous consequences in the international arena. And as such our voice as the governing constituent base that elects our leadership matters greatly. We have a moral responsibility to our fellow human brothers and sisters to speak out when their very lives hang in the balance. We believe we must not be silent in this moment of history.

We believe there is no military solution to address the root causes that underlie these cycles of violence and trauma. Violence for violence only perpetuates more violence, resentment and alienation and compound the injustices that fester across these lines. The violence must stop for a negotiated resolution to these injustices to be initiated. We believe this is of fundamental interest to all the parties concerned here, both to Israelis as well as to Palestinians. As such, we are convinced calling for a ceasefire ultimately brings us all together in the interests of peace.

We are so grateful for our common interests as a community in building our common bonds across these lines of our identities, cultures and faiths. We believe we can be a unique testimonial to how our communities can coexist with mutual respect, appreciation and care. We are grateful as well for you our leaders who understand these values and

The actions of Hamas were horrific. The Israeli government's response is also horrific. Israeli citizens are rising up in shame against the actions of their government. American Jews are leading many of the protests across the United States to speak out for peace, human rights, and the human dignity of all people. We are watching young Israeli's (nearly 300) refuse to join the Israeli military and going to jail because they don't want to be part of a murderous and dehumanizing process.

The Israeli government's actions have gone beyond self-defense and deterrence. A genocide is unfolding before our eyes. The crimes that the State of Israel is currently committing in Gaza include: the mass murder of over 32,000 Palestinians, including over 12,000 children, over 6,000 women, and 115 journalists; the use of starvation and dehydration as weapons of war against a captive civilian population; the forcible displacement of over 2 million Palestinian civilians from their homes; and the mass destruction of Gaza's civilian infrastructure including the bombing of hospitals, schools, universities, bakeries, mosques, and churches; and the damage and destruction of over 360,000 residential units.

I thank you for your willingness to speak out and I urge you to support this resolution for a ceasefire to halt the indescribable suffering which the US is supporting and funding with our tax dollars.

I'm following what's happening in Gaza: the Palestinian refugees who Israel is deliberately starving as they shelter in overcrowded tents, the injured Palestinian children who've been forced to get amputations without anesthesia, the Palestinian families shot dead by Israeli snipers as they flee hospitals, and the Palestinian boys and men stripped naked in the cold and severely tortured by Israeli soldiers in concentration camps. There have been an untold number of mass graves, field executions, and other horrific war crimes, most of which we do not even know yet due to Israel's telecommunications blackout. And now, Israel has begun its latest genocidal massacre in Rafah to slaughter or forcibly remove the 1.9 million Palestinians sheltering there—directly against the International Court of Justice's orders.

The only way to stop this genocide is a PERMANENT CEASEFIRE NOW. I affirm the Harrisonburg City Council in calling for a ceasefire in Gaza, the entry of humanitarian aid, and the release of all hostages and political prisoners. This will signal to the community and our elected officials at the federal level, that this is a significant issue of great concern in our city. My gratitude to the City Council for drafting this resolution, and placing it on the agenda, and I strongly urge the City Council to pass this resolution.

The situation in Gaza is dire. The Gaza Strip is a small strip of land (141 square miles) that is home to 2.3 million Palestinians, over half are children. The majority of Palestinians in Gaza are refugees living food, water, and housing insecure. It is one of the most densely populated places on the planet. Palestinians are confined to what the Israeli human rights organization B'Tselem has called the world's largest open-air prison. Palestinians in Gaza literally have no place to go.

It has been over four months since the beginning of a series of catastrophic events in Gaza, the West Bank, and Israel. After Hamas' attack on October 7, which killed some 1,200 Israelis, injuring thousands more, Israel launched a campaign of genocidal violence on Gaza killing some 30,000 Palestinians, over 12,000 of whom are children, and injuring almost 70,000 more. Over 1.7 million (75%) Palestinians are displaced in Gaza right now. And over 7,000 more are missing, believed to be trapped or dead under the rubble. (These numbers are from UN OCHA reports; unfortunately, horribly, these numbers are changing by the hour.) One Israeli scholar of genocide writing in Jewish Currents has called Israel's attack on Gaza a "textbook case of genocide." The conclusion was reiterated last month by the International Court of Justice (ICJ) in The Hague. South Africa brought charges of genocide against Israel to the ICJ, and in January the ICJ ruled that Israel's violence in Gaza is probable genocide.

The United States has enabled this genocide. This is one piece that sets this situation apart for me. The U.S. supplies the most military aid to Israel, \$3-4 billion a year, which accounts for about two-thirds of Israel's arms imports (the largest recipient of U.S. aid). An additional \$14 billion was part of a package approved by the Senate earlier this month. The U.S. also maintains large weapons stockpiles in Israel, which the United States has allowed the Israeli military to draw from. The U.S. just vetoed another resolution in the UN Security Council calling for a ceasefire. And in response, over the last four months, hundreds of thousands of people have organized and protested all around the world—including in our own city—calling for a ceasefire. The White House is not listening. Congress is not listening. But we are heartened by the knowledge that you, City Council, are listening.

I lived and worked in Palestine-Israel from 2004-2007 (our son, a senior at HHS, was born in Palestine during that time). My research and teaching have brought me back several times since then, including leading learning delegations. Most recently I co-led a six-week intercultural program last summer with twenty EMU students. I have been deeply distressed by Israel's assault on Gaza. Israel's violence against the Palestinian people has been extreme in its disproportionality

(and that media coverage in the west obscures): one of the most powerful armies on the planet, supported by my government, using its full might against 2.3 million besieged, poor people, half of whom are children, most of whom are refugees, in one of the world's most densely populated places.

This is an issue that resonates with so many in our community, not only because of the loved ones we have in Palestine and Israel, our deep connections to that land, or our faith commitments that demand a response. This issue resonates so strongly because it is a nodal point of solidarity for people struggling for freedom all over the world and locally here in Harrisonburg. It echoes Dr. King's words "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere. We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly." I also hear this in the words of the Israeli organization Zochrot in their call for a ceasefire: "Our safety and wellbeing are dependent on each other. No one is safe until everyone is safe."

I strongly urge the City Council to pass this resolution.

Dear City Council Members,

I ask that the City Council join dozens of other towns in the United States calling for a ceasefire on Gaza. As of now, 85% of Palestinians who were living in Gaza have been displaced. According to the AP, over 29,000 have been killed (latest statistics 2.19.2024). Using publicly available data, the nonprofit Oxfam calculated that the number of average deaths per day for Gaza is higher than any recent major armed conflict including Syria (96.5 deaths per day), Sudan (51.6), Iraq (50.8), Ukraine (43.9) Afghanistan (23.8) and Yemen (15.8). Part of the reason for this is that Gaza is so densely populated, and the reason it is so densely populated resides in the settler colonial policies that date back to 1948 and even before when the region was under British colonial rule.

This conflict didn't start on October 7th. As former Jimmy Carter stated in a 2001 interview with Charlie Rose, Israel has created an apartheid state that oppresses Palestinians. Amnesty International, Oxfam, and many other international NGOs agree.

I do not excuse Hamas's terrorist tactics or the financial corruption within the organization. However, Israel has created a kind of ghetto, cordoned off with walls, checkpoints, and barbed wire. In response to ghetto oppressions, some members of the oppressed population have descended into violent acts. When James Baldwin wrote about the race riots of 1943, he called the wealth lost from the destruction of those riots "a waste", but he also understood that "Harlem needed something to smash" ("Notes of a Native Son"). This same kind of human anguish is happening in Palestine, a place and a people that doesn't have anywhere near the resources of the Israeli government to defend itself.

The Israeli government and IDF are exacting revenge on the entire Palestinian population, including those in the West Bank, as is evident from the casualties and destruction as well as news reports of the IDF's disturbing and dehumanizing behavior. Please see the NYTimes and elsewhere for reports of the IDF's bombastic cheering when they drop missiles on Gaza apartment buildings and posting to their social media accounts pictures of them posing with Palestinian women's undergarments and calling them "sluts." This is dehumanizing behavior that is reminiscent of WWII fascism and white supremacy.

This is the moral issue of our time. I beg you to please support this initiative to call for a ceasefire.

As a lifelong member of the Harrisonburg Community and a Graduate of Eastern Mennonite University, I am in full support of this Ceasefire Resolution. We have a responsibility to promote peace here in the friendly city and to live up to our name for our citizens, especially those with family members in both Gaza and Israel.

During my time at Eastern Mennonite University, I studied abroad in both Israel and Palestine, specifically in the West Bank. I have tremendous pride for my alma mater because of the ways they challenged my world view. Eastern Mennonite offers one of the most unique experiences of any university in that they offer spending time with both Israeli and Palestinian host families in their Middle East study abroad program. In the month I lived with my Palestinian host family I learned a tremendous amount. I saw first hand the brutal life under occupation that the Palestinians were living, their families separated by countless checkpoints, their crops burned and bulldozed over, and the settler violence they experienced on a day-to-day basis. They are treated like second-class (or lower) citizens in the West Bank.

Through all of this however, I was treated with respect, love, and hospitality by my host family. They were patient with me as I butchered my Arabic pronunciations and grammar, they provided me with breakfast, dinner and as much tea as I could drink every day, and I shared moments of joy and laughter playing soccer with their children and neighbors as they attempted to claim a semblance of a normal life. I was treated far better than I deserved as an American. One whose tax dollars fund their occupation in the West Bank, and whose tax dollars now fund the slaughter and ongoing starvation of tens of thousands of human beings in the Gaza strip.

We have a responsibility as a diverse refugee resettlement community to make a stand against these horrific actions. The eye opening-experiences I had in Palestine in 2014 changed the way I thought about and interacted with democracy in this country. I am proud of my school for allowing us to have those raw and challenging experiences, and I am proud of the work my city has done in collaboration with my school. The two create a synergistic community that truly strives for acceptance, peace, love and understanding. I am unbelievably proud of this town for its support of EMU and I believe EMU is part of what makes this place such a vibrant and incredible place to live.

The absolute LEAST we can do as citizens of Harrisonburg is pass a resolution that may encourage others in our state to show support. Even if passing this resolution is solely symbolic, wouldn't we want to be known as the one city in VA that stood up for what was right? Who stood up for humanity in what will inevitably be looked at as another blunder of the US military's involvement in the Middle East? Dear City Council Members,

First, I want to thank the members of the City Council who have already decided to support the Harrisonburg City Council Ceasefire resolution and encourage those members of the Council who are undecided or opposed to please consider adding their support and making this resolution unanimous. I I am positive that every member of the Council is profoundly opposed to the terrible crime against humanity of genocide. Although it will require 2-4 years for the International Court of Justice ICJ to rule on whether Israel has is committing genocide, the ICJ did issue an order "... stating that "it has jurisdiction over South Africa's charges of genocide against Israel and that Israel's actions are plausibly genocidal."

The conventions against genocide are designed to prevent or stop genocide, not just make a judgement about whether it has occurred or not, after the fact, when it is too late. For this reason, the ICJ issued this order to Israel based on plausibility. According to Layne Mullet of the American Friends Service Committee

"The court issued an order that calls on Israel to take all measures within its power to prevent actions that violate the Genocide Convention, including killings and deliberately inflicting on the Palestinian people conditions of life calculated to bring their physical destruction. Since October 7, Israel has killed over 26,000 Palestinians – 42 percent of them children – and is using starvation and the destruction and obstruction of access to health facilities as tools of war. The Court also called for immediate measures to ensure humanitarian aid is reaching people in Gaza. This is a historic decision that should serve as a call to action for all those who have stayed silent in the face of these atrocities.

The measures demanded by the court cannot be realized without an immediate ceasefire." https://afsc.org/newsroom/international-court-justice-says-israels-actions-are-plausibly-genocidal-what-are-we-going

Our national government is, tragically, not fulfilling its responsibilities as a signatory to the Geneva Convention against Genocide. This is unfortunate because it is "our federal government" that "holds immense diplomatic and appropriations powers to save Palestinian and Israeli lives" (from proposed City Council Ceasefire resolution).

"All of our missiles, the ammunition, the precision-guided bombs, all the airplanes and bombs, it's all from the US," retired Israeli Major General Yitzhak Brick told a columnist with the Jewish News Syndicate last month. "The minute they turn off the tap, you can't keep fighting. You have no capability...Everyone understands that we can't fight this war without the United States. This fact places a heavy responsibility upon the American people to take action to change our government's current

stance. Your passage of this resolution will send a powerful message that will increase the chances that our federal government will take the necessary steps "to save Palestinian and Israeli lives." Maybe I shouldn't speak for others but I know for a fact that your passage of this resolution will bring joy and hope to the Palestinian community here in Harrisonburg, in Virginia, across the US and even in Gaza itself. It is a courageous act of solidarity and love and I cannot thank you enough for doing it.
