RE: Ordinance to allow for the employment of off-duty law enforcement officers.

<u>Summary:</u> Proposal to enact Section 5-1-11, Employment of off-duty law enforcement officers.

**Background:** Section 15.2-1712 of the Code of Virginia enables localities to adopt an ordinance allowing for the employment of off-duty law enforcement officers. As proposed, this ordinance will allow law enforcement officers to engage in off-duty employment that may require them to exercise their law enforcement authority, pursuant to rules and regulations established by the Chief of Police.

<u>Key Issues:</u> Off-duty employment of law enforcement officers enhances public safety by providing increased police presence and allows officers voluntary opportunities for additional income, without affecting HPD's available on-duty resources.

**Environmental Impact: N/A** 

Fiscal Impact: None. The off-duty hours are paid for by the party contracting for the service.

<u>Prior Actions:</u> General Order 3-1.1 already allows off-duty employment of police officers. This ordinance formally authorizes that program and ensures it is compliant with Virginia law.

Alternatives: (a) Approve enacting Section 5-1-11, Employment of off-duty law enforcement officers, as

presented; or

(b) Deny enacting Section 5-1-11, Employment of off-duty law enforcement officers..
