# Recap

#### 2017 Presentation

The RHSPCA is an open admission animal shelter that does not turn any local pet away for any reason.

As a result, intake volume varies throughout the year, generally spiking in spring and summer.

Since we do not turn animals away, some animals arrive at the RHSPCA gravely ill or are being surrendered for severe behavior and aggression problems, or both.

Without pre-screening admissions, we accept animals as they are. Many animals are perfectly healthy, rehabilitatable or treatable, but not all.

Achieving a 90% or higher "live release rate" would mean turning animals away if they are beyond our means to rehabilitate for adoption, or if they are being surrendered for the purpose of euthanasia.

The network of humane & lawful rescues has grown in the past decade, and we're proud to work with them to find forever homes.

#### Defining Euthanasia & Its Role in Animal Welfare

Euthanasia comes from the Greek words meaning "good death."

Euthanasia gently and humanely shuts an animal's body down without any unnecessary trauma, pain, or distress.


All companion animals are required to be anesthetized prior to euthanasia, rendering them unconscious and unaware.

A stronger anesthetic is administered via IV injection to bring metabolic processes to a complete stop.

As our community gains greater access to veterinary care, humane training, spay & neuter initiatives, and overall increased awareness and access to educational resources, such cases have and will continue to decrease over time.

#### **Past Data**






This graph was presented to the City Council in 2017.

Steady decrease in euthanasia of animals as a result of efforts to: increase stray reclaims; greater volunteer engagement; reduction in barriers to adoption and our ongoing work with rescue organizations.

Decrease in adoptions correlates with decrease in intakes. Proportionally, adoptions have increased over this period.


RHSPCA Outcomes 03-16


#### Harrisonburg City LRR vs. Year



## Challenges

We had 6 heartworm positive dogs up for adoption at once.


We implemented 4-Dx testing after several adopters reported back that the dogs they adopted carried tick-borne diseases like Lyme, ehrlichiosis, or anaplasmosis. Heartworms are preventable with testing and regular vet care.

We are happy to report that all 6 have found homes!

One of them, Wagtastic Beast, also required an amputation.















#### **Special Needs & Special Care**

We had many animals arrive with a condition called entropion, where their eyelids and lashes grow inwards towards their eyes instead of outward.

This painful, irritating condition can cause infections and seriously affect quality of life. Gilbert the tabby cat was one of our patients able to get surgery to correct the problem.

Funding for animals with special surgical needs like Gilbert and Wagtastic Beast comes from our Nova Medical Fund.

#### **Crushed & Broken Bones**








We have had several animals receive treatment for broken bones either via pins like Bee Bee above or amputation if the leg was crushed. Furdinand the Bull & Purdy have both found homes.

# And those who need help standing out...


