Timeframe

- 2008 Initial efforts by neighborhood to enter NTCP
- July 2014 and Oct 2016 Team Up to Slow Down Campaign
- November 2016 Increased Enforcement
- July 2017 Neighborhood Meeting
- September 2017 Council Approved Traffic Study
- February 2018 Study Complete and Petition Process
- January 2020 Required Signatures Received
- January 2020 Seeking Enrollment

Traffic Study Summary

- December 2017 Study:
 - ADT > 600 vehicles per day
 - 85th Percentile Speeds > 35 mph
 - Documented Cut-Through Traffic
- Summit, Hill, Sterling, Broad, Kelley, Gay, Wolfe, Elizabeth
- Established Neighborhood Area
