RE: Emergency ordinance to suppress the spread of the novel coronavirus, SARS-CoV-2, and the disease it causes, commonly referred to as COVID-19

Summary: A proposed emergency ordinance finding that the use of the First Church of the Brethren property at 315 South Dogwood Drive as a temporary shelter for those experiencing homelessness is a necessary and proper means of securing the inhabitants of the city from contagious, infectious or other dangerous diseases, and authorizing the use of the property as a shelter through December 31, 2020.

Background: Historically, Open Doors has provided overnight shelter to those experiencing homelessness during the winter by rotating between temporary locations; however, due to social distancing requirements and other concerns related to COVID-19, many locations are not suitable for or able to accommodate Open Doors.

The First Church of the Brethren has offered to allow Open Doors to operate at 315 South Dogwood Drive through the end of the calendar year. Considering the ongoing emergency related to COVID-19, and consistent with the City Charter's authorization for City Council to "secure the inhabitants of the city from contagious, infectious or other dangerous diseases," the proposed emergency ordinance would temporarily supersede any restrictions on the property's use as a shelter.

<u>Key Issues:</u> The CDC's Interim Guidance on Unsheltered Homelessness and Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) for Homeless Service Providers and Local Officials emphasizes the importance of continuing services to those experiencing homelessness and securing sites for temporary shelter.
